The School for Earth and Soul with John Philip Newell (Registration opens in March) July 12-14, 2022 – Celtic Wisdom 2: Sacred Earth (Price TBD)

The School of Earth & Soul will be resuming its in-person gatherings. Its purpose is to awaken awareness of the sacred in all things through the recovery of Celtic wisdom for today and to help translate this awareness into compassionate action and justice. The School follows a three-year cycle of teaching and spiritual practice. Participants may join at any stage in the three-year cycle. Mercy by the Sea will be hosting the Celtic Wisdom 2 component.

Celtic Sabbath with Program Department staff and graduates from the School for Celtic Consciousness July 14-16 These days are designed to foster deeper integration of the material presented by John Philip Newell through contemplative dialogue, prayer and rituals. Interfaith ZEN Retreat with Roshi Robert E. Kennedy, SJ (Registration opens in March) Sunday, August 14 – Saturday, August 20 (Single occupancy \$750, double occupancy \$650, commuter \$80)

This is a week-long silent retreat (Zen sesshin) during which participants practice seated meditation (zazen) together — about 12 25-minute periods per day — as a supportive community, or sangha. Roshi Kennedy and other Zen teachers will provide daily talks (teishos) to share Zen insights and to encourage sitting practice, as well as opportunities to meet privately with them (daisan) throughout the days.

Silence is observed at all times throughout day in order to deepen experience. Following the final sitting each evening, the liturgy will be offered for all who wish to participate. This is a warm, wholehearted practice of being with ourselves as we are, with things as they occur. The support of devoted teachers and one another encourages the quieting of our minds, the lessening of struggle, and the movement from self-centeredness to life-centeredness. Through this process we taste the richness of human life and become of true benefit to others and the world.

The Reclaiming of our Humanity: Being Fierce and Tender in our Call to Love, with Poet and Author Mark Nepo

Friday, August 26-Sunday, August 28 (Price TBD)

Given the trying times we are living through, we need to hold each other through our suffering, and to ask for the story that has brought each of us to today, and to complete each other by listening with an open heart. In this weekend retreat, Mark will explore how a life of meaning and love unfolds through adversity, how love awakens everything, and how care erases the walls we keep building between us.

Every generation and tradition discovers, again and again, that our spiritual journey on Earth is not to strive from here to there, but to unfold from in to out. How we do this is both personal and Universal. But do it we must, if we are to flower and offer our nectar to the world. This weekend retreat will unpack and bear witness to the turning inside out we all endure that lets Spirit show its beauty through our humanity.

The central questions remain: Will you be a good steward of the portion of Universal Spirit you are blessed to carry in the container that is your life—as well as you can, for as long as you can? And what does being a good steward of your soul mean? What does being a good steward of the light you carry look like for you personally?

Every so often, across the expanses of time, a mountain remakes itself, a forest clears itself, and the ocean reshapes its shore. And once in a generation of two, humanity remakes itself, such as we are right now. And such a remaking is both profound and painful. But here we are, being asked to put aside our old hypocrisies and all the ways we have pushed each other away. Here we are, being asked to be fierce and tender in our call to love each other until justice and healing are the same thing. Yet how do we participate in this remaking of humanity? I think one heart at a time, one truth at a time, one kindness at a time. And we can begin by remaking ourselves. —Mark Nepo
